4. Mission Support Consultation with Churchwide, and First Reading of the Revised 2023/24 Spending Plan – led by Nick Kiger, Director Mission Support ELCA, and Treasurer Shea McGrew

#### Action SC23.xx Revision of 2023/24 Spending Plan

First reading of the proposed revised spending plan. Action will be taken at the January 2023 meeting.

Shea McGrew presented Finance Team Spending Plan
Jacob Henry presented Proposed Spending Plan for NWOS
Bishop Beaudoin explained budget changes related to enhanced staff responsibilities

Nick Kiger, Director of Mission Support from ELCA joined us for this discussion concerning ELCA Proportionate Share

Shared how the NWOS Mission Support was used by ELCA (see Power Point.)

Mission Support Sharing Trends (Currently about 55% stewarded by synods with 44% stewarded by ELCA)

- Now feeling the full effects of the Pandemic and inflation/recession
- Church-wide Assembly now allows specified dollar amount for Mission Support instead of a percentage of Synod revenues

NWOS' proposal to reduce Proportional Giving by 11% in one year—would be the largest yearly reduction for ELCA

- What do you perceive the ministry priorities of the NWOS to be?
  - o Education and support to congregation
  - Training and raising up leaders
  - Teaching for community engagement
  - Pilgrimages travel to broaden perspective and engagement
  - Be church—not just go to church everyone has a role to play

  - Leadership
  - Information from NWOS to congregations not timely
  - Managing the changing church—money
- What are some strengths in the NWOS?
  - Building relationships/strengthening parishes

  - Ability to experiment to reach unchurched
  - o Great educational choices and chances
  - Staff and leadership

### Proportional Support (Mission Support)

Challenges are our reality; strengths are how we move through the reality—move forward

Nick Kiger observations/recommendation for continued conversation:

Leadership seems to be a strength in NWOS journi.faith—new leadership tool from ELCA

Comprehensive look at Mission Support strategy—how to tell stories and how synod/ELCA uses mission support—volunteer group

Congregational stewardship team from ELCA to assist synods (Tim Brown)

Mission Support story—working to improve the way we tell the mission support stories
